Summary:

Bringing together 16 partners from 10 European and Latin American countries, the SciCoMove Project gathers together historians of science, science museum curators and naturalists (paleontologists, botanists). Its objective is to study the circulation of objects from their places of origin to the collections, as well as the practices of collection, exchange and packing that have made these journeys possible. It addresses the collections of the European peripheries and provinces, and its ambition is to propose a history of science on a global scale that is not focused on the capitals and major Western institutions. The knowledge produced will enable naturalists to better exploit the collections for their research and museums to better respond to social demands, especially those emanating from source communities.
